**To Mr. LATIMER, Truro.** Married people above 40 years of age, may have a *free passage* if they have one child 14 years of age and upwards, for every year that the parents exceed 40,---that is, a father 42 years of age, or about, will be ac-

ceptable if he has 2 children above 14.

A talk by Dr Lesley Trotter

This is a story of 19th century emigration from Cornwall, when thousands of wives were 'left behind' by men departing to seek work overseas. Known as 'married widows', these women managed families and homes, and were unsung heroines, especially in the mining communities. The men usually intended to return home with a better financial position, or send for their wives and children later, but sometimes the separations became permanent.

Dr Lesley Trotter is a historian and genealogist who has conducted extensive research into how wives and families survived this separation in the 19th century and tells their stories.
